If those are some of the questions in your heart, you're not alone.

As you'll see in this magazine, even people in the Bible didn't hold back from challenging God directly about their suffering and pain.

They voiced some of the same things you have, and expressed their thoughts in very honest, raw ways.

As you read the verses included here, you'll likely hear an echo of your own angry, frustrated, exhausted, or impatient feelings.

And when you read closely,  
you'll also discover where God  
has been while you've been  
suffering, and how He feels  
about your pain.

God doesn't just stand outside of  
your pain and listen to your cries.

The Bible says He suffers WITH  
you, and even suffered FOR you.

**But—and this is important—  
we also learn from the Bible  
that He has a plan to use our  
pain to make us beautiful.**

And to do away with pain and  
suffering—forever!

Read each passage slowly and carefully.

This is only a brief selection of Bible verses on this topic, but hopefully it's the beginning of a longer journey of discovery.

Take all your pain and confusion to the God you meet here and let Him speak to you through the words you read.

May you find the peace that only God can provide.

And perhaps you'll find that you can then help others who are struggling to meet this God, too.
